Dear Friends,

We know that April Flowers bring May flowers. But it you have looked at our Bible Reading calendar, you will see that May readings bring...Psalms.

Yes, we are spending the month of May reading Psalms. All Psalms, and (except for a few days of Job at the beginning) nothing but Psalms.

This may seem like a daunting task. But if you consider the old Sunday School trick of dividing a Bible in half to find Psalms, that means that we have gone through an incredible amount of material — maybe more than you had considered you would be up for at the beginning of this year.

But it will still be a challenge, so as we begin this month, here are some ideas and tips for reading Psalms that you can use whether you are reading the Bible this year or just dip into them occasionally.

- 1-Remember that the Psalms are poetry and read them that way. After months of reading stories and laws, the Psalms are very different. And so rather than reading them literally, this is a chance to immerse yourself in metaphors and patterns of language that are very different than what we experience every day. Think back to in school when you read poetry. Think about the words as painting pictures. And fully experience the language.
- 2-Remember that the psalms are worship. And so they have different places that they would be used—both in the lives of the individuals and the worship of the community. Imagine when each Psalm might have been used. Was it a greeting to God and thanksgiving for blessings? Was it a confession and recognition of our need for God's Grace? Was it a lament that things were going horribly and the author is wondering if God is even listening? Psalms of ascent were sung as the people approached Jerusalem for the Holy Days. We might not know what some of the instructions fully meant, but we can use them to remember great congregations that knew and followed then they read those words. Try to read them out loud instead of silently sometimes, or with another person instead of alone.
- 3-Try to surround your day with them If you usually do all your readings in the morning, try dividing up the psalms so that you are reading one in the morning, one at midday, and one at night. In monasteries, the flow of time is marked by worship and reading at set times each day, always including a Psalm.
- 4-And finally, read the whole Psalm. Psalms that begin with lament often end with the greatest professions of faith. And Psalms that seem sweetness and light sometimes take a dark turn (I'm looking at you, Psalm 139). They are complicated and emotionally diverse, just like those who wrote them and those who read them. Often in worship we cut out the difficulties and smooth out the edges. Take the chance to reflect on them in all their complex glory.

Enjoy this month (plus a little more) with the Psalms. Find a rhythm that works for you to fully engage and explore with this songbook of God's people.

Mom's Morning Out is now accepting applications for 2023-2024 school year

Mom's Morning Out is a preschool for three and four year old children, providing an excellent foundation in educational/social experiences for their first and even second year. Our program provides opportunities to learn about letters, numbers, concepts such as; over, under, on, etc., colors, shapes, to transition from one activity to another, follow directions, use manners, enhance listening skills, become a classroom helper, speak in front of a group, participate in creative/fine/gross motor activities. Students also learn to increase socialization, to correctly solve disputes with other children, to take turns, play cooperatively and to become more independent. We will be beginning our 45th year this fall. Younger students must be 3 years of age on or before August 31st, 2023 and be fully toilet trained.

Mom's Morning Out closely follows the Fonda-Fultonville Central School calendar with some exceptions. Our first day of school will be Friday, September 8th, 2022 and will end on Friday, June 14, 2023. We meet on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:30 to 11:00 a.m.

Enrollment is filled on a first-come first-serve basis, with priority given to students who attended the previous year. For any questions about the program or to receive an application, please call Joann Phelps (518) 775-3454.
