"And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." – Luke 2:7

#### Dear Friends,

These are super familiar words. We read them every year. We do **not** usually read them in the last week of September. You would be forgiven for checking the rest of the pages to see if maybe you had been sent the wrong month's newsletter.

But for this year's Bible readings, we are reading of the coming of the baby Jesus in the opening days of fall instead of the darkest days of winter (don't worry, we will read them then too.)

It is one of the interesting parts of this Bible journey we are on. Things are read out of the boxes we have put them in, away from the sparkle and celebration that we give them. We read of the first home of our Lord and Savior, God-with-us, Jesus Christ. But instead of picturing the fancy nativity set that we have set up by the pretty tree, we can take the time to picture the roughhewn, wooden feed box full of smelly hay. We can strip the baby of his radiant, white, flowing wrappings and see the bands of cloth, the scraps, that Mary used to keep her baby clean and warm. We can take the holy family off of the table surrounded by poinsettias and tinsel and put them in the back room and leftover space they found themselves in.

Because the Luke passages have nothing to do with the holiday that we tie them to. They are about a greater truth, a truth that should be a part of every day, every month, every season. Jesus Christ was born among us – God with us – Emmanuel.

We also must deal with the birth and death of Jesus being separated by two weeks rather than 3 or 4 months. We are forced to remember that this is the story of the same person. We tend to ignore the death at Christmas time and just forget about the birth at Easter, but they are connected and important each and every day.

I hope that you enjoy this last quarter of reading together. It is where it will all come together, where everything that we have read will come to fruition. Where all God's promises that have been made will become flesh in Jesus and all God's plans will be realized in the church. Whatever the season, this is the Good News, this is what we believe.
