Dear Friends,

It is back to school time! Time to buy school supplies and wait excitedly for schedules and pick out the perfect outfits for the first day.

As I thought about what words would be important to share with those who are going back to school, I thought of these words from Paul. Despite Paul's reputation for some tough love, and harsh words, he was really good at putting onto paper his hopes for the people that he was writing to. And in the process, he created a record of pastoral advice for the early church.

So in the spirit of passing along good advice to others, I would like to share his words on living in community. It is good advice for students, teachers, all in the school community

Here are the words of Paul, from his letter to the Colossians. Imagine him as the school principal at the assembly on the first day:

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience.

Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other;

just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body.

And be thankful.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God.

And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. – *Colossians 3:12-17*

...And if you think that you are not a part of the school community, I would ask you to consider that everyone in the community that has a school is part of the school community. We are all called to teach and raise up the next generation. We are all called to set an example for those who are learning how to be neighbors and friends. So be involved and be interested. Remember your school days and what a difference it made when someone took an interest in what was important to you and do that for someone else.

Have a great first day of school. Have a great every day of school. Have a great time helping to educate and lead and inspire through your actions, your knowledge and your faith.



We are glad to continue to serve the "least of these" in Jesus' name in this small way.


