

At the beginning of last month, a pair of robins built a nest in the gutter pipe outside the atrium door. We would watch them swoop in with their sticks and twigs to set up the safe little home. They then began to guard the area, one of them always sitting on the lawn from a distance. There was some concern that they might begin to attack people going in and out of the door, but they seemed to realize that we meant their family no harm and just stuck to watchful waiting.

Soon three little heads popped out of the nest, squawking for food. Mom and Dad kept them fed and healthy, hunting in the lawn for worms that quieted them down and made them grow.

It soon seemed to get a little crowded, and one morning, one of the little ones seemed to fall out of the nest onto the ground. Those of us watching didn't quite know what to do. Would their parents put them back in the nest? Were they big enough to fly on their own? Were their siblings following and did we have to be prepared for a tragic end to this little family?

We didn't know what to do, but the adult robins did. They came and nudged the little one. They got it moving. It took off and proceeded to run into a car tire. It shook that off and went a bit further into the parking lot. And then into the parsonage yard. Soon the other two followed and the three of them were hopping around and taking tentative flights, with their parents watching, showing how it worked, even loudly yelling at a neighborhood cat who got a bit too interested. By the next day, they had all flown to other yards and trees and the adults were perched on the fence, literal empty nesters.

There are several verses of Scripture that compare God to a mother bird, and watching these bird parents at work, it made sense.


Jesus said as he looked over the city of Jerusalem, "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!" (Matthew 23:37)

I recently saw a post online that said something like, "Me screaming at a bird to get out of the road before I hit it makes me realize what God must feel like watching me all the time."

All the time, we hop out of safety and into danger. We jump out of safe nests and fly right into the car tires. But our God, who loves us an a mother hen loves her chicks, is there to pick us up, nudge us to safe places to spread our wings, and sometimes even stand between us and danger and scare it away (while yelling at us to move!) We don't always know it. We don't always like it. We can tend to squawk back and think we can go our own way. But God will always help us.

God lifts us up on eagles wings – the wings of a mother eagle, putting her eaglets on her back and flying so that they can feel the wind and the power, and eventually be brave enough to jump off and try their own wings.

I don't know what happened to our little robins, but I know that God does. "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. And even the hairs of your head are all counted. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows." (Matthew 10:29-31)

Mom's Morning Out is now accepting applications for 2023-2024 school year

Mom's Morning Out is a preschool for three and four year old children, providing an excellent foundation in educational/social experiences for their first and even second year. Our program provides opportunities to learn about letters, numbers, concepts such as; over, under, on, etc., colors, shapes, to transition from one activity to another, follow directions, use manners, enhance listening skills, become a classroom helper, speak in front of a group, participate in creative/fine/gross motor activities. Students also learn to increase socialization, to correctly solve disputes with other children, to take turns, play cooperatively and to become more independent. We will be beginning our 45th year this fall. Younger students must be 3 years of age on or before August 31st, 2023 and be fully toilet trained.

Mom's Morning Out closely follows the Fonda-Fultonville Central School calendar with some exceptions. Our first day of school will be September 8, 2023 and will end on June 14, 2024. We meet on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:30 to 11:00 a.m.

Enrollment is filled on a first-come first-serve basis, with priority given to students who attended the previous year. For any questions about the program or to receive an application, please call Joann Phelps (518) 775-3454.
